

Musa, Niaz Take Bangladesh On Kilimanjaro *Musa makes it to his second of the Seven Summits*

Desk Report

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The first Bangladeshi conqueror of the Mount Everest, Musa Ibrahim, along with his co-mountaineer Niaz Morshed Patowary, has climbed the highest summit of Kilimanjaro Mountain in Tanzania, the Kibo.

It was confirmed by an email on that the duo made it to the Kibo, locally known as Uhuru, on Monday at 10:48am.

Kibo, locally known as Uhuru, is the highest peak of African continent and fourth highest among the the top seven peaks in the world, known as the 'Seven Summits'.

The peak is at a height of 19,340 feet from the sea level.

Three members of North Alpine Club Bangladesh (NACB), led by Musa, began their Kilimanjaro expedition on September 8 from a 6,000 feet high base camp.

A third member of the team, Abdus Sattar, had to come back from 13,000 feet due to high altitude sickness.

The triumphant have been given Uhuru Peak summit certificate by Kilimanjaro National Park and Tanzania National Park authorities yesterday.

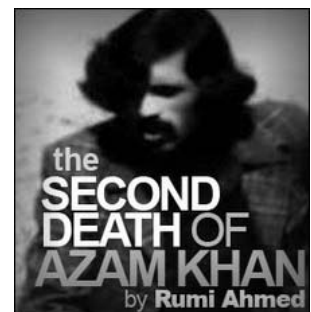
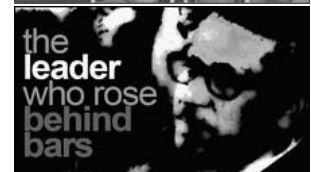
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
